#### To Pedestrians and Cyclists

### No Unlawful Dumping!

### Don't Do It. Don't Encourage It. Don't Allow It.

#### Unlawful Dumping is a Crime.

According to the Waste Management and Public Cleansing Act, unlawful dumping can be **punishable** for <u>up to five years in prison</u>, <u>up to 10 million yen in</u><u>fines (up to 300 million yen for companies)</u>, or <u>both.</u>

When unwanted garbage tossed unlawfully is found near farming roads, forests, empty lots, or other overlooked areas, the harm does not end there. Not only does it ruin the local landscape, but it also invites others to dump their garbage in the same areas, pollutes





the soil and water sources, and creates foul smells, which all eventually worsen the local living environment.

#### Help Create an Environment that Discourages Unlawful Dumping

By regularly cutting long grasses and installing fences, you can help prevent others from dumping unlawfully in your area.

#### If You Spot Trash that has been Dumped Unlawfully, Call 110!

Call the police immediately, and report the location and items that have been dumped.

### Mind Your Manners as a Pet Owner!

The City has been receiving many complaints about pet owners!



#### Please take your pet's poop back home with you!

Please make it a habit to have your pet go to the bathroom before going out on a walk. Make sure to bring a pooper scooper and bags just in case your pet poops during the walk, and, as their owner, please be responsible and bring back their poop home with you.

#### Please do not feed stray cats irresponsibly!

Feeding stray cats will inevitably encourage their population to grow, which will be negatively affect the local community from their cries and droppings. As the stray cat population grows, so will the possibility of harassment and abuse that befalls them. Thus, irresponsible feeding is ultimately very unfavorable for stray cats. Also, cats will not feel stressed out as long as they have a defined territory, so please keep your housecats indoors.

#### Please make sure to vaccinate your pets to prevent rabies!

Rabies is a frightening disease that will ultimately be fatal to your pet. Vaccinating your pets will ensure a safe environment for you and everyone around you (\*The rabies vaccine is mandated by Japanese law). Aside from the group vaccines administered in April, you can also get your pet vaccinated at a veterinary hospital.

For items made up of multiple materials such as wooden furniture or futon bedding, please separate the parts into their respective materials as much as possible.



Please come to the center to confirm availability if you are bringing in tatami mats (more than five) and demolition rubble (more than one *kei* truck full). Please remove metal parts, glass, springs, and other miscellaneous parts from wooden furniture, lumber, mattresses, sofas (under 1m long, 20 cm thick) before bringing it in for disposal.

### to your Valentine this year~

### **Chocolate Walnut Muffins**

#### Ingredients (makes 6)

Whole egg ..... 6og Granulated sugar... 4og Salt...a pinch Honey...15g Milk...4og Unsalted butter...6og Cake Flour...8og Baking Powder... 4g Almond Powder ... 3og Chocolate...5og Walnuts ...5og

#### Preparation

- Bring eggs and milk to room temperature.
- Mix flours and baking powder together and sift well.
- Roast your walnuts and let cool (Roast at 16oC for approximately 10 minutes).
- Roughly chop chocolate and walnuts.
- Preheat oven to 190°C.



- Brown the butter and keep at 50°C. (Heat the butter in a saucepan on medium heat, stirring constantly with a rubber spatula. Once the butter turns golden brown, turn off the heat and place the bottom of the saucepan in cold water to kill the heat.)
- 2. In a bowl, combine the egg, honey, salt, and granulated sugar and mix well with a whisk.
- 3. Add the browned butter and whisk well.
- 4. Add the milk and whisk well.
- 5. Add the sifted dry ingredients and mix well.
- 6. Add some of the chopped chocolate and walnuts to the bowl, and combine with a rubber spatula. Leave the rest of the chocolate and walnuts for topping.
- 7. Pour the mixture evenly into the muffin molds and top with the remaining chocolate and walnuts.
- 8. Lower the oven temperature to 180°C and bake for approximately 18 minutes. Check to see if the muffins are baked thoroughly by sticking a wooden skewer through the center. If the skewer comes out clean, then it is time to take the muffins out of the oven.

### **Baked Chocolate**

#### Ingredients (makes about 13) Chocolate ... 1009

Cake Flour ... 20g Cornstarch ... 20g



#### Preparation

- Melt the chocolate using the double boiler method. (Place a temperature-safe bowl over a saucepan of simmering water).
- Combine and sift the dry ingredients together.
- Preheat the oven to 160°C
- 1. In the bowl with the melted chocolate, add the dry ingredients and mix well.
- 2. Put the mixture into a piping bag that has the piping tip in place (We recommend using the star-shaped piping tip to make nice rosettes as pictured above).
- 3. Pipe the chocolate mixture onto a baking tray lined with parchment paper.
- 4. Lower the oven temperature to 150°C and bake for 10~12 minutes.



# Receive Up to a Maximum of 3.6 million yen in Assistance over a Ten-Year Period

Up to 30,000 yen in assistance per month (360,000 yen per year) for student loans paid back within the applicable period (  $\bigotimes$ ).

☆The one year period from Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> of the previous fiscal year before the application year i.e. the applicable period for the FY2025 payback program would be for student loans paid back from October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024.

**Who Can Apply?** Must apply and receive designation beforehand Must live in Kyotango City for at least 10 years National and local government employees excluded

- Graduated from a Japanese university, graduate school, two-year university, technical college (limited to 4 to 5-year programs), or specialized training college (specialized course or general course)
- Must be under 30 years of age
- Currently residing in Kyotango City and either employed at a company in or commuting from Kyotango City.

**[Important Notice]** Current recipients of the assistance must re-apply every year (A notice will be sent out before the application period).
