In preparation for the 1st World Longevity Summit spearheaded by Kyoto Prefectural Medical University, there was a press conference for the Special International Delegation Association and a meeting between government leaders from the Republic of Costa Rica.

Republic of Costa Rica

Conference Held with the Minister of Foreign Affairs and the Minister of Trade

Costa Rica is a country well-known for multiple areas where people lead long lives. On April 25th, there was a meeting with Minister André from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Minister Tovar from the Ministry of Trade about Costa Rica's attendance at the World Longevity Summit. Dr. Hitoshi Yaku, the President of the World Longevity Summit Executive Committee and the Kyoto Prefectural Medical University gave an overview of the Summit, and Mayor Nakayama gave an introduction of Kyotango City, which is set to be the host city. Minister André explained that he will return to Costa Rica and confirm with stakeholders in academia and the industry before arranging a delegation to participate in the Summit.

The Committee is also reaching out to the United States, Greece, and Italy among other countries, and will hopefully bring forth good opportunities.

Youth Overseas Homestay Program – Final Presentation

Students Experienced Personal Growth During Their Time in Australia

After finishing the onsite program in Perth, Australia, the junior high school students made their final presentation on May 8th at Agri Center Omiya.

Through experiencing life overseas, this program aims to develop the talents of Kyotango's youth and cultivate them to grow and thrive as active members in a global society. The delegation of twenty students conducted research surveys on Rottnest Island, a protected reserve of pristine natural beauty. Afterwards, they visited a secondary school in Perth where they had cultural exchange with the local Australian students, built and programmed robots, and conducted fieldwork with local university students within the city of Perth.

Based on the opinions they collected from the local people in Perth, the students presented on what they found appealing in Kyotango and their ideas to solve local issues in smaller groups at the final presentation. The students stood proudly at the lectern with their eyes directed towards the audience, and talked about what they learned and how they grew from their experience



overseas.

People with Disabilities

Changes in Criteria to Reflect the Needs of Program Users

To help ease daily life at home for people with disabilities, the City is offering financial assistance when purchasing necessary tools. To reflect the needs of those who

use these tools, we have changed some aspects of the program. There is a defined maximum assistance for every tool. If the expense exceeds the maximum assistance, the difference will be paid out-of-pocket. Depending on your tax payments to your local government, you may have to have to cover a portion of the cost.

June 30th is the payment deadline for the Municipal/Prefectural Residence Tax, Forestry Environment Tax (1st Period), and the National Health Insurance Tax (1st Period).

If your taxes are not paid by the deadline, a demand letter will be sent in the mail, so please pay by the deadline. ※*In addition to bank wire, you may also use smartphone apps such as PayPay, d-Barai (d-Pay), or auPay to pay your taxes.*

➤ **Please Help Recycle your Non-Burnable Trash**

Assistance/Subsidies, etc.

➤ Financial Assistance for University Students' Medical Expenses

For Who?: Guardians for university-age dependents who are registered as Kyotango City residents.

In FY2025, the dependent is:

- Turning ages 19-22
- Enrolled in a university or vocational school recognized by the City
- Not receiving welfare medical care (single parent household medical care), public assistance, or child-rearing medical assistance
- Not married (includes common law marriages)

【Assistance Amount】

Medical expenses above 200 yen paid out-of-pocket for one medical institution per month (differentiation between hospital admission and outpatient care, includes insured pharmacies).

【Applicable Period for Assistance】

Medical expenses incurred from April 2025 to March 2026

- Copy of Student ID or Certificate of Enrollment
- Copy of Proof of Insurance Dependency (any document that proves enrollment as a dependent under current insurance or student insurance)
- Original receipts for medical expenses

As vaccine supply was unstable in 2024, the vaccination period has been extended for those who could not receive the rubella vaccine.

For Who?: Males born from April 2nd, 1962 to April 1st, 1979, who have taken the antibody test on March 31st, 2025 and were found to have insufficient immunity for the

rubella virus.

※*Individuals who have taken the antibody test after April 1st, 2025 are not eligible.*

Check Your Evacuation Shelters and Routes Once Again

What to do to Protect Yourself during a

Flood or Landslide Disaster

Q: Who should evacuate?

A: Everyone who is in an area that is at risk during a natural disaster.

Flood and Landslide Disaster Hazard Map

If you don't have a Disaster Hazard Map, please get a copy from the General Affairs and Disaster Prevention Section in Mineyama or at your nearest Citizens' Bureau. You can also access it on the City's website.

Check the Hazard Map to see if your location is at risk of disaster.

In times of flooding or rising water levels due to heavy rainfall, the areas expected to flood (Predicted Severe Flood Zones) and their respective flood depth are marked with different colors. Areas that pose significant risk of bodily harm or to human life due to landslide disasters (Yellow areas: Landslide Alert Zones) and areas that pose outstanding risk of infrastructural damage (Red areas: Landslide Special Alert Zones) are separated by their degree of danger. If you live in these areas, please evacuate ahead of time.

Q: When should I evacuate?

A: The City will issue evacuation orders and information to everyone, so

please take the appropriate action according to the table below.

The City will issue disaster-related information over the city-wide P.A. system.

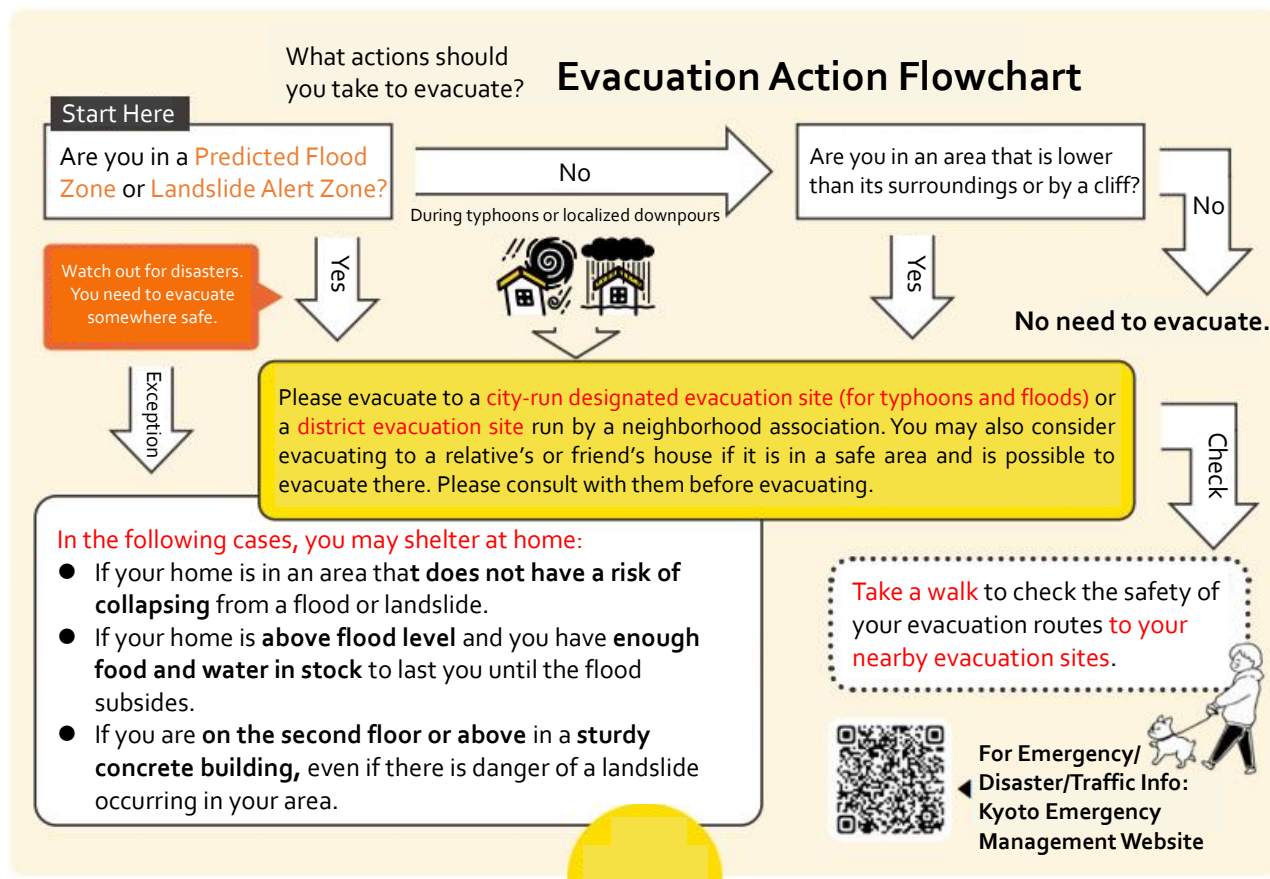
The City will determine areas that are at risk of floods or landslides based on meteorological data, water levels in the streams and rivers, water content in the soil, etc., and then will notify city residents via the P.A. system or an emergency email blast.

However, depending on the conditions around you, you may encounter a situation where you should get to safety beforehand, instead of waiting for orders from the City.

**For information on Warning Levels, please check the disaster information from the Japan Meteorological Agency (Warning Levels 1~2) and the City (Warning Levels 3~5) so that you can decide what actions you need to take for yourself and your loved ones. If you live in a high-risk area and a Level 3 or 4 Warning has been issued from the City, please evacuate to safety as quickly as possible.*

Q: Where do I evacuate to?

A: Please evacuate to somewhere safe. In Japanese, evacuation is “hi-nan,” which means to avoid danger. It does not only mean to go to an evacuation shelter.



What if it's too late to evacuate?

If the roads have flooded into rivers during a heavy rainstorm and it is dangerous to head outside, please evacuate to a room above the second floor of your home or make a calm and rational decision for the best possible action to get yourself and your loved ones to safety.

But, before that happens...

The stronger and longer rain falls, the more dangerous conditions will become. It is crucial to not hesitate and evacuate while conditions are still safe. Especially when rainfall is expected to reach its peak at nighttime, please evacuate before it gets dark outside.

Tasty Tidbits of Knowledge

Don't Let the Rainy Season Get You Down!

Chilled Ooba Leaf and Myoga Ginger Pasta

Eat this on those hot and humid days!

The aroma and crunch from ooba leaf and myoga ginger will refresh your palate and mind! These ingredients are also known to promote appetite and digestion, so try adding them to your meals for this season!



Ingredients (Serves two):

Spaghetti160-200g
Tomato (large)..... 1 fruit
Ooba.....10 leaves
Myoga ginger.....3 bulbs
Ponzu sauce.....5 tbsp
Olive oil.....2 tbsp
Sugar.....1 tbsp
White sesame seeds/Dried bonito flakes..... to taste
Salt..... to taste

Instructions:

1. Boil a generous amount of water in a pot. Salt the water and then boil your pasta according to the instructions on the package. Once the pasta is cooked, place it in ice water.
2. Peel the tomato using the blanching method and dice into large pieces. Combine the ponzu sauce, olive oil, and sugar to make a marinade, and add the tomatoes. Chill in the fridge.
3. Thinly slice the ooba leaf and myoga ginger and place in cool water. Use a strainer to remove.
4. Combine the pasta and tomato marinade and give a quick mix. Then, top it off with the ooba and myoga from step 3, sesame seeds, and dried bonito flakes. Serve, and bon appetit!

Fun Food Trivia

Though technically different, the ooba leaf is also called shiso and is written with the Chinese characters for purple (紫) and revival (蘇). According to one theory originating from ancient China, when a youth weakened by food poisoning drank a tonic brewed from shiso leaves, he immediately recovered and became well again. From this tale, the leaf was called “the purple leaf of revival.” Sounds like an item you can get in a video game!
