# Beautiful Town Planning Council Responds to Wind Power Generation Project Plan's Inquiry on Mt. Isanago

Statement Submitted to Kyoto Prefecture Requesting Utmost Adherence and Reflection of Contents within Report

On April 6<sup>th</sup>, the Beautiful Town Planning Council compiled a report to Mayor Nakayama in response to the proposed plan for the Kyotango City Mt. Isanago Wind Power Generation Project (provisional name) planned to take place in the Mineyama and Omiya areas by private contractors.

During an inquiry conducted in November of last year, the City requested the Council to provide a statement regarding surveys and deliberations about the overall environmental effects of the project --with particular attention to natural surroundings, disaster risk, and residential life-- and about the legal procedures involved. Following the submission of the Statement of Opinion to the Prefecture regarding the Tango Peninsula First and Second Wind Power Generation Projects (provisional name), the Statement of Consideration for Environmental Impact about the Planning Stage of Kyotango City Mt. Isanago Wind Power Generation Project was drafted as a culmination of onsite surveys and three council meetings between a board of town representatives and advisors specializing in each relevant field.

In the report, the Council expressed that the City should sincerely value the contents of the report when proceeding with necessary procedures related to assessing environmental impact into the future. In addition, the Council released their opinions towards the project plan (see below).

Based on this report, Mayor Nakayama submitted the Statement from the Viewpoint of Environmental Conservation to Prefectural Governor Nishiwaki on April 8<sup>th</sup>, and requested the Governor to adhere and reflect the contents of the Statement to the utmost degree.



## Main Opinions Regarding the Project Plan

If the project has no way to prevent any major effect on the health, living

environment, biodiversity, or natural landscape in the local area or causes any disaster now, at any point in the survey process, or as a result, and the City is unable to address and rid the grievances of the people, the project shall make the necessary revisions, which include cutting down on the scale or terminating the project altogether.

- Any effect the project may have on the environment must provide an explanation based on scientific evidence.
- In the planned project area, the contractors must grasp the situation around past geological disasters i.e. landslides, assess the effect of the project, and articulate any risk of disaster.
- The contractors must survey the effects of the project on the Takeno and Masudome Rivers that flow through the planned project site.
- The contractors must learn and understand about the historical and cultural significance of Mt. Isanago, such as the Hagoromo legend, and respect the sentiments of the local residents.
- In the event a disaster happens on the planned project site, the contractors will designate responsibility and provide an explanation.
- The contractors will make considerations to coexist with the local community and contribute to enlivening the local economies.
- Etc.

The opinions above have been selected and abbreviated by the Life Environment Section based on the specific situations surrounding the City.

## Issue 1 - Protecting our Youth from Online Criminal Activity

The internet is a very convenient place to get information. However, it also

provides many places for criminals to hide. Much of the criminal activity that happens on the internet targets young people in their teens or 20s, who may not even realize they're involved in illicit activities or violent relationships until it's too late. As a community and family, let's work to prevent these kinds of crimes from happening.

# Lowering the Legal Age of Adulthood and the Issue of Coerced Pornography and Sexual Exploitation of Teenage Girls (aka "JK Business")

From April 1<sup>st</sup> of this year, an amendment to the Civil Code went into effect and lowered the age of adulthood in Japan. At the age of eighteen, teenagers can enter contracts without the consent of their parents.

Unfortunately, businesses who use social media advertisements and other sly tactics to lure in unsuspecting teenagers have only increased the number of victims forcibly coerced into pornography or sexual exploitation. (For more details, please take a look at the Cabinet Office's website)

## Online "Violence" – Is this happening to someone close to you?

- 1. Requesting, distributing, or sending images or videos of sexual nature is Digital Sexual Assault!
- 2. Repeated and unwanted calls or texts that instill fear is stalking!
- 3. Verbal attacks and shaming are Internet-bashing/slandering!
  Internet sites and social media platforms may suddenly become dangerous places to be.

#### Kyotango City's Intimate Partner Violence Lecture

Intimate Partner Violence (date domestic violence) is domestic violence that occurs between unmarried couples. This year, presentations about the dangers of intimate partner violence were given at the municipal junior high schools. We are progressing with education programs to prevent intimate partner violence and teaching youth to treasure themselves.

On top of using your MyNumber Card as a personal ID card, you can also use it for online applications that need your e-Tax number or a document to verify your identity. If you don't have a MyNumber Card yet, use this opportunity to apply for one today!

## Main Ways to Apply for a MyNumber Card

## 1) Apply through the Support Window at City Hall

Things You'll Need: ID Verification Documents, Notice Card (You can still apply without this)

The Process: 1) Take your picture at the counter (you can also bring your own profile photo)// 2) Fill out the application form

## 2) Apply Online via your smartphone

Things you'll need: A smartphone, QR Code for the application form, a photo file of your face

The Process: 1) Take a picture of your face using your smartphone camera// 2) Access the application form through scanning the QR code // 3) Fill in the necessary information and upload your profile picture.

## 3) Apply by Mail

Things you'll need: Profile picture, the application form, and the designated envelope for your MyNumber Card application

The Process: 1) Prepare your profile picture// 2) Fill out your application form and attach your photo// 3) Seal in the designated envelope and take it to the post box.

In about one and a half months to two months' time, a letter with information about your MyNumber Card will be delivered to your mailbox. Please come to the City Hall to retrieve your MyNumber card. (Prior reservation needed)

### Receive Myna-Points by Making a MyNumber Card!

Myna-Points are points given to you by the National Government when you use your MyNumber Card to reserve/apply, re-charge your cashless payment service of choice, or go shopping.

- Shop with reusable bags instead of buying plastic bags
- Buy items with minimal packaging
- Think about what you need before you buy
- Use your own refillable drink bottle!

#### ✓ Recycle

- Take your paper waste to the designated collection sites!
- Choose items made of recyclable materials
- Sort accordingly so materials can be reused

## Help us to get rid of this invasive plant species!

#### **Lanceleaf Tickseed**

(*Coreopsis lanceolata*, Japanese name Oo-kinkei-giku)

#### Characteristics:

- Large, bright yellow blooms from May through July
- Flowers can grow around 5 cm in diameter, and stems





30~70cm long

- Blooms can be single- or double-layered
- The tips of the petals are jagged, and leaves are long and tongue-shaped
- Found in clusters in yards, alongside roads, empty lots, and by streams and rivers

#### How to Remove:

Pull the plant out by the roots and let it dry out for 2-3 days. Shake off as much dirt as you can and dispose of it in burnable trash.

If it is hard to weed the plant out, cut it at the root before the flowers bloom. The stems will grow out again, so remember to cut them again in two months' time.

## About the 4th Dose of the Coronavirus Vaccine

As per the direction of the National Government, the City is administering the fourth dose of the coronavirus vaccine to prevent the development of severe symptoms.

For Residents over 60 years old....... After submitting your Vaccination

Application, you will receive a notice from the City about your appointment date and location.

For Residents with Underlying Conditions... After submitting the Underlying Condition Report Form and Application that was sent to each household around May 25<sup>th</sup>, a Vaccination Ticket will be sent to you. Please reserve your own appointments.

## Overview about the 4th Dose

Target Recipients (Must have received 3<sup>rd</sup> Dose)

- Must be 60 years or older on the day you receive the 4<sup>th</sup> Dose
- ➤ Have underlying conditions if 18~59 years old
- Deemed at risk of developing severe to critical symptoms by a doctor

#### Vaccination Period


After five months or more has passed since your 3<sup>rd</sup> dose

#### Administered Vaccines

- Pfizer
- Moderna

#### Vaccination Sites

- Individual Vaccinations (At each medical facility)
- Group Vaccinations (Yasaka Community Center)
- \*Vaccinations are free
- \*Subject to change in accordance to the National Government's policy
- \*At the current moment, which vaccines will be available at which vaccination site is still to be determined.



## General Timeline for Residents over 60 years old (and have received their 3<sup>rd</sup> dose before February 2022)

Xin the case a typhoon is approaching or the risk of a natural disaster is apparent, please evacuate before a warning is issued.




Reach out to other people in your area, and get to an evacuation site or other area of safety as quickly as possible.

- For residents living in areas where a Level 3 or Level 4 warning is issued by the City, please evacuate as guickly as possible.








Confirm what to do during an Evacuation and your Evacuation Routes
