You can now Apply for your Certificate of Residence, Family Register, and other Official Documents Online!

Perfect for busybodies who don't have time to stop by City Hall!

As long as you have a MyNumber Card, smartphone, and credit card,
you're ready to go!



What is it?

Apply to get official documents like your Certificate of Residence and Family

Register straight from your smartphone, without having to go to City Hall. When you apply, you will need your MyNumber Card information. Your documents will be sent to you by mail after paying with your credit card.

Things to Prepare:

In order to apply online, please have the following three items:

- MyNumber Card
- Smartphone
- Credit Card

How to Apply:

1) Download the app

Scan the QR code for the application of your choice (you can also access it from the city's official LINE(*)1. Download the e-signature app from the webpage and make an account.

(*)1 For more information about the City's official LINE Account, please refer to the second to last article in this month's issue.

2) Enter your information

Once you've made your account, enter your necessary personal information and the PIN for your MyNumber Card.

3) Wait for the mail

Once the email requesting payment is sent to you, enter your payment information. Once the City Hall has confirmed your payment, your requested documents will be sent in the mail.

- 1) You would have to submit a Notification of Moving Out to the City Hall closest to your residence.
- 2) Submit a Notification of Moving In to the City Hall of your new residence.

From now...

- 1) You can submit a Notification of Moving Out online (no need to go to City Hall)
- 2) Submit a Notification of Moving In to the City Hall of your new residence.

With your MyNumber Card and smartphone, you can submit your Notification of Moving Out any hour of the day when you move outside of the city.

Traffic Safety Countermeasure Promotion Team Set Up in the Defense Bureau to Prevent Future Accidents

Special Kyogamisaki Communications Site Safety Measures Liaison Meeting Called into Session

On January 24th, a special safety liaison meeting with Kyogamisaki Communications Site was held in a round-robin fashion about the delayed relay of



information regarding the traffic incident on November 8th last year involving military personnel in a vehicle that had hit a pedestrian, followed by a report from both the Kinki-Chubu Defense Bureau and the City.

Verification Results from the Kinki-Chubu Defense Bureau

Basing off of their Way of Thinking towards Providing Information about Traffic Accidents (henceforth referred to as "the way of thinking") that was confirmed at the 25th Safety Liaison Meeting held in December 2020, whether or not the accident necessitated information to be swiftly delivered, the Kinki-Chubu Defense Bureau reported that their response was passive and did not confirm the details of the incident quickly enough. In addition to strengthening their collaboration with relevant institutions for the sake of appropriately and securely implementing this way of thinking, the Defense Bureau explained that they established the Traffic Safety Countermeasure Promotion Team to prevent any traffic incidents from happening in the future, and will implement countermeasures regarding traffic safety and address traffic incidents surely and swiftly.

Verification Results from the City

The City received a report from the Defense Bureau on November 9th that the accident resulted in property damage, and would be addressed at the next liaison meeting. Afterwards, even after the City confirmed time after time, the Defense Bureau responded that it was a property damage accident and the incident was judged as such. Then, after the City came across information from a third party that the accident could have sustained injuries to another person, it was crucial for the City and the Defense Bureau to come to a thorough understanding of the entire situation and will secure a transparent way to address the situation according to their way of thinking from here on out.

Watch over them warmly







Please do not feed stray cats.






