

What Kyotango City is Providing to Support the Victims

Free Public Housing for Disaster Victims

The city is offering five spots in public housing apartments, and four spots in city-run lodging facilities for agricultural, forestry, and fishery development. *As of February, one person has moved into a city-run lodging facility for agricultural, forestry, and fishery development.

Financial Support for Hotel/Inn Lodging

Collaborating with the Kyotango Tourism Association, participating hotels and inns will offer their rooms as temporary lodging for evacuees. Participating locations include Hotel Tango Kingdom and Yasaka Yama no le at Swiss Village.

The City has set up donation boxes to support the victims and recovery efforts. Your donations will go through the Japan Red Cross Society and the Red Feather Cooperative Fund to the disaster victims.

Prepare for Earthquakes and Tsunamis Beforehand!

When the Noto Peninsula Earthquake happened, a Tsunami Advisory was also issued for our city. By taking the right steps to prepare in case disaster strikes, you can minimize the damages from the disaster. Please check the Kyotango City Earthquake and Tsunami Hazard Map (Japanese only) for evacuation sites, dangerous areas on your evacuation route, emergency supply checklists, and more life-saving information.

City Budget Adjustments for FY2023

The City has apportioned 203.73M JPY (National Program) for additional financial support for households paying the per capita portion of municipal residence taxes and low-income households with child dependents.

Who is Eligible to Receive Aid?

- 1) Households that are only paying the per capita portion of their 2023 municipal residence taxes will receive 100K JPY in financial assistance.
- 2) Households that are exempt from paying their 2023 municipal residence taxes (includes households whose financial situations have worsened dramatically) and households that are only paying the per capita portion of their 2023 municipal residence taxes will receive an additional 50K JPY for every child dependent under 18 years of age.

A Letter of Proxy will be Required to Apply for your Family's Tax Certificate

Starting April 1st, 2024, a letter of proxy will be required even if a family member from the same household applies for a tax certificate at the Tax Section or at the service counter in the Citizen's Bureau in order to protect your personal information. Field Fires are Prohibited by Law! Deal with your Garbage Appropriately

Aside from the special exceptions listed below, field fires are, in principle, prohibited. Burning fires in equipment that do not meet the standards defined by law (i.e. dirt pits, oil drums, cinderblock pits, etc.) is also prohibited. Garbage should not be burned at home or in the fields. Instead, please put them in city-designated garbage bags and bring them to the garbage stations or directly to a disposal center so they can be properly disposed.

The following actions are special exceptions for burning field fires:

- 1) Burning firewood or other insignificant daily tasks (i.e. fallen leaves, etc.)
- 2) Fires necessary for agriculture or forestry (rice straw, burning grasses along the banks of rice paddies, etc.)
- Traditional customs and other fires necessary to carry religious events (i.e. Dondoyaki, etc.)

You will be fined!

If you burn a field fire or outdoor fire illegally, you may be subject to punishment up to either **five years in prison** or a **fine of 10 million yen** (for businesses/organizations, up to **300 million yen**), or **both**.

Notice

Even if you burn a fire that is a special exception as listed above, please be wary to not disturb others. You will receive a strict warning if there are complaints from neighbors or if your actions worsen the local living conditions.

New Changes to Coronavirus Vaccine Administration

Free Vaccinations will end on March 31st, 2023.

Until now, the COVID-19 vaccine has been offered for free as a "special emergency vaccination". Starting in April, it will be categorized as a regular vaccination, like the influenza vaccine. Those who wish to receive the vaccine will have to pay out-of-pocket for a portion of the cost. For those who are taking the vaccine as an optional vaccination, then you must pay out-of-pocket for the vaccine, no matter the season.

- Pedestrians and cyclists should wear reflective material and a bicycle helmet.




Protect A Heart, Protect A Life Let's Aim to Build a Community where Everyone Can Be At Ease
