The New Commander at Kyogamisaki Communications Site

Visits City Hall

On September 21st, Kyogamisaki Communications Site Commander, CPT Daniel Quandt visited the Mayor of Kyotango City for a customary greeting.



After Mayor Nakayama expressed his gratitude to the military personnel for their participation in the City's General Disaster Training Drill in August, he requested that the military remain diligent in enforcing traffic safety and noise control countermeasures in regards to the electric generator on base. The Mayor also requested further exchange between the local community through events such as local events and beach clean-ups.

In response to the military's traffic safety measures, Commander Quandt explained that there were weekly reminders on traffic safety and driving lessons, and



if an accident were to occur that there would be swift communications to the Kinki- Chubu Defense Bureau. In regards to the operation of the electric generator, he requested the City's understanding when the generator needs to be in operation during a power outage or

emergency maintenance during nighttime hours. In regards to exchange activities, the Commander stated that the military personnel would like to keep participating in more volunteer activities and events, and would like to provide their swift cooperation in the event a natural disaster happens.

As of September 1st, there are 116 people who are over 100 years old living in Kyotango City. The ratio of centenarians in Kyotango's population is high at 226.32 people per 100,000, which is 2.7 times higher than the ratio of Kyoto as a prefecture and about 3.1 times higher than the even the national average. On Respect for the Elders Day on September 18th, the City celebrated the longevity of forty-seven new centenarians.

On September 26th, National Geographic, a famous magazine from America, spent two days in our City covering our long-living citizens for a special feature. This magazine is published and read by people all over the world, and their attention was brought here to Kyotango. In the world, Japan is known as a Country of Longevity, and within Japan, Kyotango is known as a Town of Longevity, which has attracted particular attention from around the globe.

Prevent Emergency Incidents with these Countermeasures

Let's rearrange our surroundings so that you or a loved does not suffer from a life-threatening injury or health-related incident!

Emergency Prevention are steps that you can take to prevent serious injury or health incidents by identifying accident-causing items or being aware of the below points. Let's fix our surroundings so you don't have to call an ambulance to save you from a life-threatening injury or health incident. And, let's work together to make our community safe and peaceful!

Call 119 immediately if someone...

- Is unconscious
- Is not breathing
- Has sudden chest pain
- Has slurred speech
- Unable to move half of their face or has a crooked face
- Has a sudden and sharp headache or numb limbs

Let's try checking what kind of risks there are around us!

Preventing Falls

- Everything in the room is neatly organized and put away
- Minimize level changes in the room
- No cables or cords in the hallways or walkways
- Stairways are well-lit and have handrails



Preventing Falls from High Places

- Install handrails on the stairs
- Install barriers around beds to prevent falls
- Do not leave items that small children can climb on top of
- Use stepladders with an assistant/spotter



Preventing Heat Shock

- Warm the changing room and bathroom
- Splash warm water on your body before entering the bath
- Keep bathwater temperature to 41°C and do not take long baths
- Refrain from entering the bath after drinking alcohol



Preventing Choking

- Cut mochi or similar foods into small pieces before consuming
- Chew thoroughly and eat slowly
- Take your meal while drinking fluids
- Watch over your children while they eat to prevent accidental ingestion
