Mineyama Komaneko Festival

Since the Edo Period, Mineyama has thrived from producing woven silk textiles. Cats have thus been favored by the local people as they protect the silk from being damaged by rodents. Kijima



Shrine, which is located within Kotohira Shrine, was brought in from Kyoto to Mineyama by silk merchants and silkworm breeders and has continued to celebrate the *komaneko* or guardian cat deities. The Komaneko Festival hopes to reconnect the local people with the significance of *komaneko* and *chirimen* silk in a town-walk event that surpasses space and time.
