Emergency Voicemail Hotline **1 7 1**

This phone service is used during large-scale disasters as a voicemail message board. People in the affected disaster areas and people from other areas can leave and listen to the voicemails.

Try it Out!

You can leave test messages to familiarize yourself with the service on the following days:

- 1st and 15th of every month
- January 1st ~ 3rd
- During Disaster Prevention Awareness Week
- During Disaster Prevention and Volunteering Week

How to Leave a Message

1 Listen to guidance

1 Dial **1 7 1**

2 Press **2**

3 Dial the phone number of the person you want to reach in the disaster-affected area from their area code

4 Record your voice message

How to Listen to a Voice Message

1 Listen to guidance

1 Dial **1 7 1**

2 Press **2**

3 Dial the phone number of the person you want to reach in the disaster-affected area from their area code

4 Play message

※ This service can only be used during emergencies and on trial days (see dates on the left).

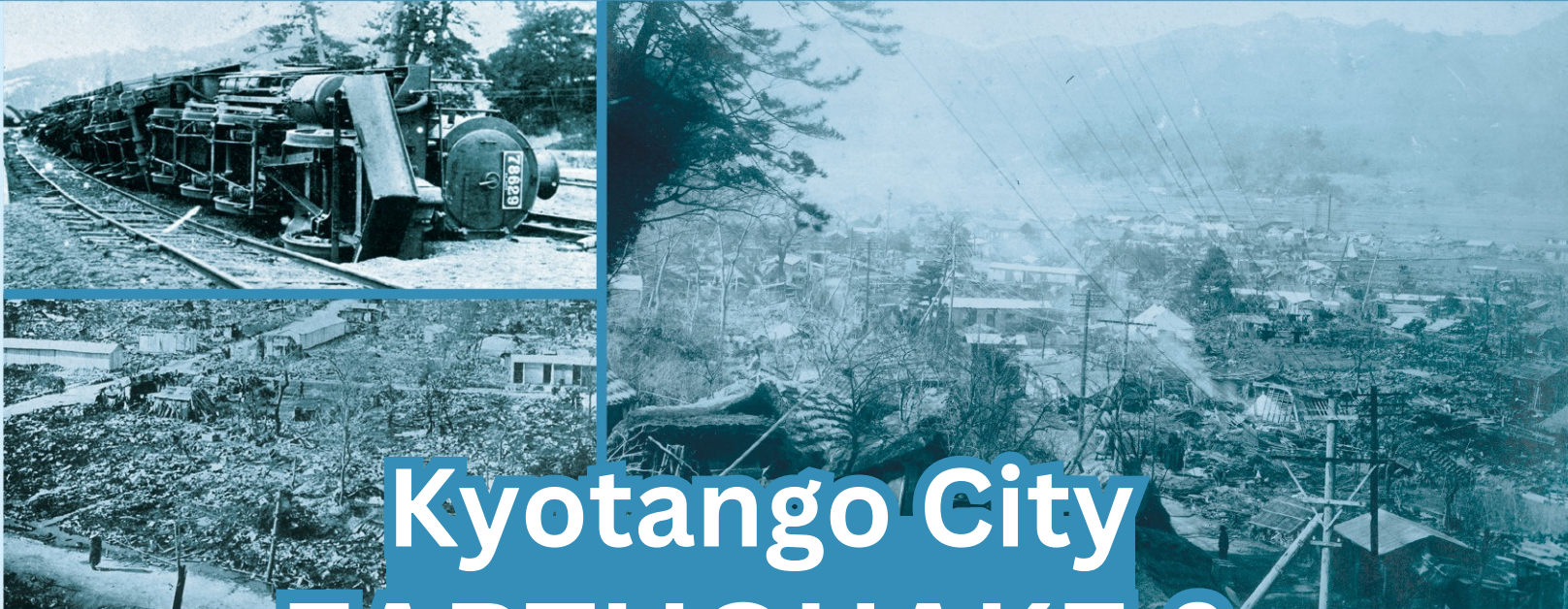

### About this Hazard Map

- This map was created to help residents quickly evacuate in the event of an earthquake or tsunami.
- Inside, you can find information about the projected impact from the Gomura Fault, which significantly affects Kyotango City, such as the Seismic Intensity Distribution Map, Total Building Collapses, Liquefaction Hazard Map, and Tsunami Disaster Warning Zones, as well as damage projections for an earthquake on the Yamada Fault.
- The Seismic Intensity Distribution Map, Tsunami Disaster Warning Zones, and other projections may have greater-than-expected damage or area of influence depending on the circumstances.
- For preparations against floods and landslide disasters, please refer to the separately-published *Kyotango City Disaster Prevention Map*.
